

Requirements and Responsibilities of Supervisors for Provisional ANZICA Members

Responsibilities

The supervisor is responsible for ensuring, to the best of their ability, that Provisional Members have a good understanding of the following areas to enable them to obtain full membership:

- Different types of ART treatment and the technologies involved
- Emotional issues experienced by patients experiencing infertility/undergoing fertility treatment
- Donor implications counselling for donors and recipients and their families, where relevant, involving eggs, sperm and embryos
- Surrogacy counselling for surrogates and intending parents and their families, where relevant.
- Policy and legislation related to practice
- Relevant practice guidelines (e.g. ANZICA, RTAC, NHMRC)
- Issues to consider in donor linking (for donors, recipients and donor-conceived people and their families, including siblings, where relevant)
- Payment for supervision to be negotiated between parties.

At the completion of the provisional period the supervisor will need to sign the supervision statement.

Requirements

If you are interested in being on the list of accredited ANZICA supervisors, please submit the following details to the ANZICA membership committee.

To be eligible you need to have been a full ANZICA member for a minimum of 12 months.

Please email your CV specifically detailing:

- 1. Your experience in fertility counselling and list any areas of expertise such as
 - Donor implications counselling and 3rd party reproduction
 - Surrogacy
 - Donor linking with adults
 - Supporting patients experiencing infertility/undergoing fertility treatment
- 2. Previous experience as a supervisor

It is recognized that some areas such as surrogacy and donor linking are very specialized and not practiced by everyone working in the field as such provisional members may need to seek supervision from more than one person over the course of their training.
